Murray Buckwaldt

Messrs. Allan Eckford and Murray Buckwaldt are credited with saving the lives of three men who were in danger of drowning when their boat sank in the icy water of Muskrat Lake on Friday, December 4th, 1953.

On that day Messrs. Russell Purcell, aged 60, his son Jack, 27, Mansell Hill, 30, and Clarence McBride, 25, set out from the shore of the Beall homestead in a rowboat powered by an outboard motor, intending to cut wood on a woodlot farther up the lake. About 100 yards from shore the boat sank suddenly and the four men were thrown into the icy water.

Fortunately Mr. Eckford and Mr. Buckwaldt were loading hay at a barn near the lake and Mr. Eckford heard the men cry for help when he stepped outside the building.

Rushing to the shore, he saw the men in distress and, breaking in the door of a nearby boathouse belonging to a summer cottager, got out a boat and with Buckwaldt went to their assistance, bringing all four to shore. Mr. Purcell, who had been held up in the water by his son Jack, was dead, having succumbed to the shock of immersion in icy water. The three survivors, however, were rushed to Mr. Eckford's home where they were confined to bed and treated for shock.
